Families United Network, Inc. Raising Awareness of National Foster Care Month

Scranton, PA, April 26, 2010 – May is National Foster Care Awareness Month. Almost 20,000 Pennsylvania children are in foster care according to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services*. Families United Network, Inc., a private, non-profit foster care and adoption agency, strives to raise awareness of the need for foster families with a variety of outreach activities this month. Events are also planned to recognize the dedicated individuals currently providing foster care.

“We are constantly looking for families across the state, who will be a good match for children needing temporary foster care,” said Families United Network’s Executive Director, Leo McLaughlin. Children in foster care come from urban, rural and suburban areas. The goal of the agency is to identify the most suitable environment for the child or sibling group. “If we are not able to place the child with family or someone already familiar to them, we do our very best to keep the child in their home school district. For that reason we have five foster care offices across the state dedicated to training and supporting foster families,” said McLaughlin.

Erica Sheahan, Program Supervisor of the Families United Office in Scranton has good reason to celebrate: “We have incredible individuals and families throughout the region who provide foster care for us.” Sheahan went on to stress, “The most important qualification for a foster parent is that the person has time, energy and a stable home environment.” The agency has a number of individuals, single parents, grandparents and empty nesters who are doing an exceptional job and always need more help. This month the agency is hosting a number of activities to celebrate the dedication of foster parents and to educate individuals about the process of becoming a foster parent. On May 3rd the Scranton office will be hosting an Orientation Meeting at 5pm. They are also hosting a picnic on May 29th at Washington Park in Throop from noon to 3pm for foster parents, children, staff and anyone wanting to learn about foster care.
